LGBTQ+ stands for lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer & questioning, and the positive '+' aims to represent and respect everyone on the gender and sexuality spectrum, including intersex. For more than 20 years we have been creating safe spaces where LGBTQ+ young people aged 13-25 can flourish; reaching their full potential in life, work and education:

Through our innovative youth work which empowers young people to feel a sense of belonging, and achieve their own goals.

Through our equality accreditation programme, the LGBT Charter - we ensure the places young people live, learn and work are as inclusive as possible.

Through our youth participation and policy work we position young people as experts in their own lives and amplify their voices to decision makers to inform positive change.

LGBTQ+ young people have increased opportunities through meaningful relationships and partnerships with other organisations.


IMPROVING YOUNG PEOPLE'S LIVES THROUGH CREATING INCLUSIVE ENVIRONMENTS

## **HOW WE SPEND**








On average for every £1 LGBTYS spends, 82p goes towards our direct work, 17p is spent on support and running costs and 1p is invested in generating future income

We reached 1024 young people directly and more than 30,000 through the LGBT Charter



#### **AGE**

- 42% of our young people are 13-17
- **6** 58% of our young people are 18-25



#### **SEXUALITY\***

- 5% identify as asexual
- 23% identify as bisexual
- 19% identify as gay or lesbian
- 9% identify as pansexual
- 10% identify as Queer or questioning
- 15% not listed above



#### **GENDER\***

- 19% identify as a female
- 31% identify as a male
- 27% identify as non-binary
- 4% identify as questioning
- 19% not listed above

53% of our young people identify as transgender

# OUR IMPACT LGBT CHARTER

- education settings and organisations currently on their charter journey or signed up and ready to get started.
  - education settings and organisations achieved a charter accreditation (26 schools and 16 organisations).
- clients across 29 different local authorities took part in our LGBT Charter programme.
  - schools are currently part of our LGBT Charter for Education.

# **OUR IMPACT**AWARENESS



Delivered LGBT Awareness Training to over 1800 individuals.

83,250 new site visitors across year with 54,587 accessing youth work groups and support section (ten times higher than previous year).





Published our national research into what 'Life in Scotland' is like for LGBTQ+ young people across all areas of their life and shared this with our partners.

Over 50,000 followers across Twitter, Facebook, Instagram and linkedin. Our tweets had 3.9 million impressions. We closed our Twitter account in April 2023.

**HEALTH & WELLBEING** 

said our support helped them make positive decisions about their health and wellbeing.

## WHAT OUR YOUNG PEOPLE TELL US

**CONFIDENCE & RESILIENCE** 

said being involved with LGBTYS has helped them to respond better when they have a disagreement or argument with someone.

said their involvement with said their involvement. LGBTYS increased their confidence.

felt more able to communicate their needs to other people.

said involvement with Edb 173 has enabled them to learn new skills that will help with education, training, said involvement with LGBTYS has volunteering or employment.

**70%** said being involved with LGBTYS has helped them know what to do if they are in an unsafe situation.

## WHAT OUR YOUNG PEOPLE TELL US

97%

agreed the LGBT Charter had created a more inclusive environment for their LGBT service users/pupils and their staff.

"In doing the LGBT Charter our school has had an increased support and understanding of helping young people to come out as LGBT+, the school also has made sure that the LGBT+ Community and LGBT+ Rights are more widely spoken about and given more attention – we have also found in classes there is less tolerance for Homophobia, Biphobia and Transphobia."



84% said being involved at LGBTYS made them more aware of their rights.



80% said being involved at LGBTYS meant they more able to express their voice and make a difference.



Two MSYP's were supported to represent LGBTQ+ young people's rights and quality of life in Scotland, in the Scotlish Youth Parliament.



Young people from both The Trans Rights Youth Commission and The Non-Binary working group met with key decision makers around Gender Recognition Reform and LGBT equality.



The views of LGBTQ+ young people were heard by the Scottish Government Working Group on ending conversion practices.
